## 5 December Home Maintenance Tips to Remember

We all get caught up with the holidays in December, but here are 5 tips to keep your winter home running all season long.

- 1. Check your gutters. Be ready for the rain that comes with winter. Make sure your gutters and downspouts are free of debris to prevent clogs that can damage or break your gutters and even put a strain on your roof.
- 2. Check your electrical. Take a look at your main panel and make sure the breaker wires are insulated and are not discolored. If you spot potential problems, schedule a professional electrician to do further testing and evaluation.
- 3. Clear your dryer vents. Dryers are a common cause of house fires, so reduce the risk by cleaning the lint screen, but more importantly, the lint vent which is located at the back of most dryers.
- **4. Seal your windows.** Check for gaps in your windows and doors by simply feeling for cold air with your hands. Add new weatherstripping or caulk where needed. Ask your local home improvement store for recommendations depending upon the age and type of your windows.
- **5. Reverse your ceiling fans.** Many of us forget this simple task that keeps the warm air down low in winter where it belongs. Most ceiling fans have a switch to reverse airflow.

## No-Bake White Chocolate Peppermint Oreo Truffles

#### Ingredients

27 regular sized Golden Oreos
2 peppermint candy canes
1/2 package cream cheese (4 oz)
1 1/2 cup white chocolate to coat
your truffles
3 crushed peppermint candy canes
for garnish

### Directions

In a food processor, process Oreos and candy canes until fine crumbs. Add the cream cheese and process until the dough comes together (it will form a large ball).

Line a baking sheet with plastic wrap or foil. Roll Oreo mixture into balls and place on the baking sheet. Freeze at least 2 hours or until solid.

In a double boiler (a small pot with a glass bowl sitting on top will work just fine, as long as it is far off the bottom of the pot), melt the chocolate: add 1 inch of water in the bottom and bring to a simmer. Place bowl on top and add the chocolate to the bowl. Simmer over low heat, stirring constantly, until white chocolate is melted and smooth.

Dip Oreo balls in white chocolate, sprinkle with crushed candy canes and set back on baking sheet to set up. Store in the refrigerator until ready to serve, or freeze for up to 6 months.
