May is National BBQ month so grab your favorite meats or veggies, heat up your grill and celebrate.

Here's a quick and easy homemade BBQ sauce to pull together in about 15 minutes. This recipe makes about 2 cups.

it's a great sauce for chicken, ribs, and pork, but it also takes the flavor up a notch on a burger in place of ketchup, or as a sauce for a BBQ chicken pizza.

Ingredients

2 cups ketchup 1/2 cup apple cider vinegar 1/4 cup packed brown sugar 2 tablespoons honey 1 tablespoon Worcestershire sauce 1 tablespoon lemon juice 1 teaspoon Stone House Seasoning 1/4 teaspoon hot sauce optional

Instructions

Whisk together all ingredients in a medium saucepan situated over medium heat. Allow to come to a bubble and then reduce the heat to low. Allow to simmer until thickened, about 10 minutes.

Serve immediately or allow to cool slightly and store in an airtight container in the refrigerator for up to a week.
